Operational costs	\$1,200
Boat & Trailer maintenance	\$1,500
Boat & Trailer registration	\$300
Disabled Sailing USA	\$250
Major repair set-aside	\$1,500
TOTAL	\$20,750

All of these costs are covered by donations from individuals and organizations. Footloose receives no government grants.


